1. New Courses/ Workshops Added to the Curriculum

 Developed teaching format, thematic modules, synoptic writing assignments, reflective/creative assignments, Canvas shell and extensive list of 21 readings (articles, book & book chapters)

2. Modifications to Existing Courses

Redesigned the entire FYP curriculum from three courses to six workshops. Art 102, 2-D Design; Art 112, 3-D Design; and Art 103, Beginning Drawing were changed to Art 1020 Design Studio: Surface and Process; Art 1120 Media Studio: Space and Time; and Art 1030 Drawing Studio: Perception and Color respectively. New descriptions of courses and workshops:

Drawing Studio: Perception and Color (3). Fall, Spring. Studio explorations of drawing, light and color. Visual discernment and drawing skills are developed in two workshops: Drawing from observation- introduction to the tools and techniques for accurate and expressive draftsmanship; and Color and Light- practical application of color theory and lighting effects for accurate representation and expressive communication.

Media Studio: Space and Time (3). Fall, Spring. Creative explorations of sculptural and time-based art.
Principles of construction and design of works extended in space and time. The course is composed of two workshops: 3D Design- organization of space and form, exposure to various construction methods, tools and materials, and 4D Design- introduction to chronological design concerns, kinetics, installation, audience, actions and documentation.

Design Studio: Surface and Process (3). Fall, Spring. Studio explorations of art making and visual communication. The course is composed of two workshops: 2D Design- introduction to the elements and principles of visual organization; and AMP, Art Methods & Practices- introduction to studio-based research, visual problem solving, creative strategies, and practical application of theories of visual signification.

- Revision of course content for UNIV 101 to introduce several important contemporary issues and practices
 in art and design. Five thematic, multimedia lectures were developed to support the student's studio
 practice in ART102, 103, and 112. These include: "Deconstructive Analysis- How the visual
 Communicates"; "Art and Artists- Roles and Expectations"; "Art and Technology"; "In Search of the BodyExplorations of self, race, class, gender and ethnicity".
- Development and adoption of Project Standards, a template to be used by instructors in the development of all major projects assigned in all sections ART 102, 103 and 112.
- Revision and reorientation of the mission and goals of the First-Year Program.
- Revision and replacement of 4 out of 5 project assignments for ART 102 to bring the course content more in line with the new emphasis and mission of the First-Year curriculum.
- Complete restructuring of ART 103 projects to bring them more in line with the new emphasis and mission of the First-Year curriculum.
- Creation and implementation of a uniform grading & attendance policy for ART 102, 103 and 112.
